## Metamora Pleasure Driving Show

**Greetings Carriage Drivers,**

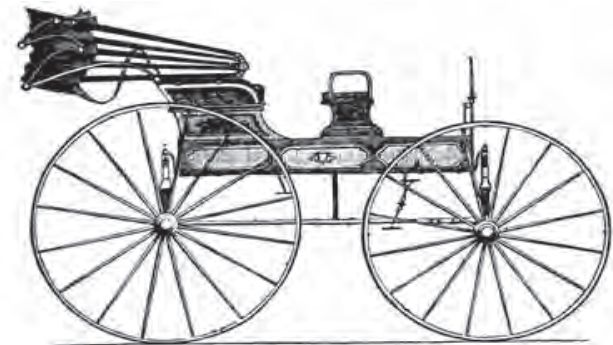
The fifth annual Metamora Pleasure Driving Show will be held on July 8-10, 2011. Frank Andrews and Barbara Chapman are hosting the show again this year. They invite you to come early to enjoy the unique carriage driving afforded on their Windrush Farm and the surrounding Metamora Countryside.

The nearby village of Metamora offers special shopping opportunities for horse lovers as well as dining in an atmospheric old stagecoach inn. Other restaurants and shops are within short driving distances. Motels in Lapeer and Imlay City are approximately 15 miles from the farm. Several excellent golf courses are also conveniently located.

The Metamora Combined Challenge, new last year, proved very popular and is being offered again on Friday. The combined placings in dressage and obstacle driving will determine the challenge winners in four divisions. On Saturday and Sunday, pointed classes for eight Pleasure Division Championships will be held as well as some open classes.

New for 2011 are three classes, the Meadowbrook/Road Cart, the Metamora Silver Whips and the Metamora Pleasure Drive. Additionally a non-pointed, specialty class, the Metamora Horseless Carriage will be conducted during our Friday evening gathering.

Trophies for the Show Grand Champion, Concours D'Elegance, Division Champions and Combined Challenge Winners will be presented. The show ring and surrounding lawns are very suitable for traditional and antique vehicles. Social gatherings with food, libations and a great auction are planned for the evenings.

**From I-75:** take Lapeer exit, 81 (M-24). Go North on M-24, 19 miles to Dryden Rd. Turn East (right) on Dryden Rd., approximately 3.6 miles, to Barber Rd. Turn South (right) onto Barber Rd. Windrush Farm is .6 miles on the left. Follow the MCDA signs.

## Entry Information

Entries open May 20 & close June 20

Entries are accepted first come first served

1. The first five classes for each driver will be at the rate of \$20.00 per class. Additional classes for that same driver will be \$15.00. After June 20 post entries will be \$25.00 per class. Exception: the entry fee for Metamora Horseless Carriage class will be \$10.00. Entries will be considered complete when all forms, payments, Negative Coggins Tests (dated within 12 months of the show) are received. It is the driver's responsibility to see that all paperwork is complete, including signed waivers from all grooms and passengers riding with the driver.
2. Entries for additional classes may be made during the show up to 2 hours before the classes are held.
3. An entry is defined as a combination of horse(s), vehicle and driver and must be assigned a specific entry number. A change of any part of the combination constitutes a different entry and must be assigned a separate number.
4. The State of Michigan requires a Veterinary Interstate Health Certificate, dated within 30 days of the date of the show, for all out of State equines.
5. The Show Management reserves the right to decline any entry and/or return any entry fee before or during the competition, without being liable for compensation.
6. The Show Management reserves the right to combine, divide, or cancel classes or divisions if the number of entries warrants such a change. Entry fees for classes canceled due to lack of entries will be refunded by mail after July 11th.
7. In case of an equine being entered and not exhibited, entry fees will be forfeited unless a veterinary certificate attests to the inability of the animal to participate due to illness or injury. The certificate must be mailed on or before July 5th to the Show Secretary. Stall fees are not refundable.
8. Professional tent-stall stabling will be provided on the grounds and stalls must be reserved by June 20. The stall fee is \$125, with two bags of shavings provided for each horse. Additional shavings can be purchased on the grounds for \$7 per bag. Tack stalls will be \$120. There will be only one equine per stall. The stalls will not have to be stripped after the show.
9. Trailer in fee is \$50 for the entire event, but all equines must be trailered in on a daily basis.
10. There is no electricity available in the stabling area.
11. Motor homes, RVs, etc. are permitted. Hook-up to electricity is limited, first come first served. If a generator is used, you will be parked in a designated area. There is a \$100 charge for camping with electrical hookup and a \$25 charge for the weekend for non electrical camping.
12. Please include your truck/trailer size on the entry form. Parking is limited; you must be able to park in a designated parking space.

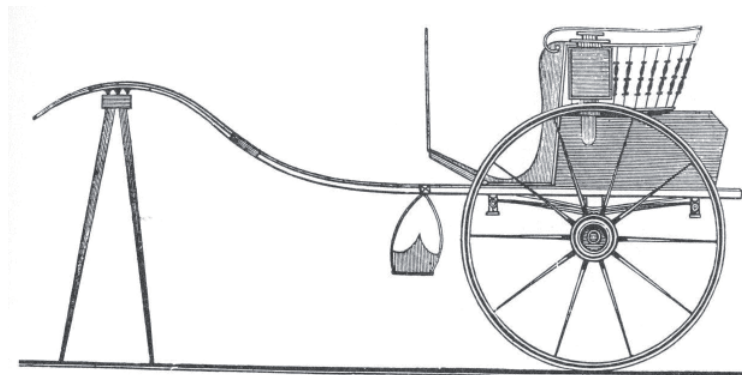

## Changes for the 2011 Show

1. A Novice Horse/Pony Division has been added and is open to those equines that have not won 3 first place ribbons in an ADS or USEF recognized Carriage Driving Pleasure competition.
2. Working - Meadowbrook/Road Cart, a non-pointed class for a single horse or pony put to a meadowbrook or road cart style vehicle has been added.
3. Metamora Silver Whips, a non-pointed class has been added. Open to drivers 60 years and older.
4. Metamora Horseless Carriage, a non-pointed class to showcase vehicles and appointments has been added.
5. Each Pleasure Division (except Junior, Novice Horse/Pony and Novice Driver Divisions) offers six classes: Turnout, Reinsmanship, Working, Pick Your Route, Your Route/My Route and the Metamora Pleasure Drive - Turnout class.
6. The Novice Driver and Novice Single Horse/Pony Divisions offer five classes: Turnout, Reinsmanship, Working, Pick Your Route and Your Route/My Route.
7. The Junior Division offers four classes: Turnout, Reinsmanship, Working and Pick Your Route.
8. The Pair Division has been split into Pair Horse and Pair Pony.
9. Small ponies are those equines up to and including 12.2 hands. Large ponies are over 12.2 hands up to and including 14.2 hands.
10. Friday is the Metamora Combined Challenge day. Divisions are for Single Horse, Large Pony, Small Pony and Pair Horse/Pony. Marathon vehicles are allowed in any division on Friday.
11. Motor homes, RVs, etc. are permitted. Hook-up to electricity is limited, first come first served. If a generator is used, you will be parked in a designated area. There is a \$100 charge for camping with electrical hookup and a \$25 charge for the weekend for non electrical camping.

## Show Rules and Procedures

1. The MCDA Pleasure Driving Show is recognized by the American Driving Society and every class offered herein which is covered by the current rules and specifications of the Society will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. Please consult 2011 ADS Rulebook for full specifications.
2. Rules for Metamora classes are fully explained elsewhere in this Prize List and conform to the spirit and intent of the ADS general rules for safety, conduct and cruelty.
3. An entry is defined as a combination of horse(s), vehicle and driver and must be assigned a specific entry number. A change of any part of the combination constitutes a different entry and must be assigned a separate number. In the event that a vehicle is disabled or judged unsafe to start or continue, management may authorize the substitution of another vehicle without issuing a new number.
4. All entries must have an entry number before entering any class. It is the driver's

## Show Rules and Procedures, continued

- responsibility to display the proper number for the turnout entering the ring, obstacle course or the Metamora Pleasure Drive.
5. A wire wheeled vehicle is permitted only if the vehicle is an antique with long wire spokes and hard rubber tires.
  6. Marathon vehicles are permitted on Friday, but are not allowed in any other pleasure or open classes.
  7. Small ponies are up to and including 12.2 hands. Large ponies are over 12.2 hands up to and including 14.2 hands.
  8. Drivers may cross enter divisions provided they can make all classes in a timely fashion. Exception: Novice H/P, Novice and Junior drivers may not cross over in division classes. Novice and Junior drivers may enter open classes. Novice Horse/Pony may NOT enter open classes.
  9. Juniors under 11 years of age may enter the Friday's dressage classes but not the obstacle class.
  10. All dressage, pleasure and obstacle classes and the warm-up area will be held on grass.
  11. Schooling will not be allowed in the main ring or on the obstacle courses at any time. Exception: Horses and Ponies may be hand walked in the show ring on Thursday, July 7.
  12. There will be a designated area for all other schooling along with practice obstacles.
  13. No cantering or galloping will be allowed in any class.
  14. On Thursday afternoon, July 7th, the following will be available at the Secretary's office: order of go for Friday classes and maps for Saturday/Sunday obstacle classes and the Metamora Pleasure Drive. Obstacle classes will be set up in time to allow competitors to walk each course before competing.
  15. No driver, horse or groom may compete more than once in the same obstacle class, or in classes with the same course including the Metamora Pleasure Drive -Turnout class.
  16. Equines may not be entered more than once in the same dressage class. However, competitors may enter two consecutive levels with the same horse and driver combination.
  17. The State of Michigan requires you to display a slow moving vehicle sign on your vehicle when traveling on public roads. We recommend brakes and/or breeching when driving on the farm trails or roads
  18. Dogs must be leashed at all times except when performing in the Carriage Dog Class. Please clean up after your dogs

## Pleasure Divisions and Class Awards

- There are five Pleasure Divisions (see Classes at a Glance) consisting of six classes, five will count toward championships. Only one (the best placing) of the two obstacles classes will be used. The Novice Horse/Pony Division and the Novice Driver Division have five classes, all of which count towards their Division championship. An eighth Pleasure Division is for Junior Drivers and has four classes all of which count toward their Division championship. The entry with the highest total points in each Division will be the declared Champion; second highest point total will be Reserve Champion. Points earned only accrue to a specific entry number.

Class points will be assigned as follows:

1st place - 6 points      2nd place - 5 points      3rd place - 4 points  
4th place - 3 points      5th place - 2 points      6th place - 1 point

- Six ribbons will be awarded in all classes. Exception: Horseless Carriage class: The winners in each of the four categories will be awarded a commemorative trophy and ribbon. All other entries will receive an evaluation ribbon.
- Each winner of a Pleasure Division Championship will be awarded a commemorative trophy and a ribbon and will have his/her name inscribed on a perpetual trophy. The Reserve Champion will receive a ribbon. If a tie in Pleasure Championship points is to be decided, the following will be used: the best placing in the reinsmanship class or a drive-off using the ADS Pleasure Driving rules.
- The Champions from the Single Horse, Single Large Pony, Single Small Pony, Pair Horse and Pair Pony Divisions will be invited to participate in the Grand Champion Invitational Class. The class will be judged as in a working class. The winner will be awarded a commemorative trophy and ribbon and will have his/her name inscribed on a perpetual trophy.
- The winner of the Concours D'Elegance will be announced immediately following the winning entry's last class. The winner will be awarded a commemorative trophy and ribbon and will have his/her name inscribed on a perpetual trophy
- All perpetual trophies will be retained by MCDA for subsequent display

## Metamora Combined Challenge Divisions and Class Awards

- The Combined Challenge is based on Friday's classes. The four divisions are Single Horse, Single Large Pony, Single Small Pony and Pair Horse/Pony. An Entry may compete in two consecutive levels of dressage and once in the time competition class. An entry's best dressage placing will be combined with their time competition placing to determine the winner of each division's Combined Challenge award. Dressage placing breaks ties. Points earned only accrue to a specific entry number. Points are described above.
- Six ribbons will be awarded in each class.
- Combined Challenge winners will receive a trophy and ribbon.

## Metamora Class Descriptions

### Metamora Pleasure Drive - Turnout

This class is designed to give drivers the opportunity to turn out in their finest while completing a pleasure drive.

Preliminary Judging: Entries will be individually inspected in the arena. Spares are required and will be inspected. After inspection, each entry will be excused to proceed to the Pleasure Drive Course. Order of go will be posted on Thursday afternoon, July 7th.

Pleasure Drive Course: Drivers are encouraged to carry a groom/navigator who may assist in pointing out the route, but may not handle the reins, whip or brake. There is no time limit. The designated course will be approximately 3-4 miles in length over scenic public gravel roads and some hills, brakes or breeching recommended. The recommended gait is a trot, but the competitor may walk at his/her pleasure. Cantering is prohibited and Rules of Road Apply. A slow moving vehicle sign required.

Overall impression and fitness will be observed on course and at the conclusion of the drive.

To be judged:

50% on overall impression and

50% on way of going.

Suitability of each entry as a pleasure to drive.

The following aspects will also be considered toward the overall impression:

Horse - manners, way of going, condition, appropriateness and grooming.

Harness - condition, appropriateness and cleanliness.

Vehicle - condition, appropriateness and cleanliness.

Driver - driving skills, posture, appropriateness and neatness of attire.

### Metamora Carriage Dog

Judged primarily on the suitability of the dog to serve as a companion (maximum of one dog per vehicle). The dog should be standing, lying down or seated on the vehicle. The dog WILL NOT be allowed to run behind, beside or at the axle of the vehicle.

To be judged:

60% on the suitability of the dog to serve as a companion.

30% on the performance, manners and way of going of the horse(s).

10% on the overall impression of the turnout, including the dog.

Entries with a dog clearly not under control will be eliminated.

### Metamora Silver Whips

This class is open to drivers 60 years of age and over showing horse or pony either single or pair. This pleasure driving class will be judged both ways of the ring at a walk, slow trot and working trot but not a strong trot. Entries should stand quietly in the line-up. At the discretion of the judge, selected entries may be asked to return to the rail for a workout or to perform an individual pattern.

To be judged:

45% on the performance and manners of the horse(s) or pony (ies)

45% on the ability and skill of the driver

10% on the overall impression of the turnout

## Metamora Class Descriptions, continued

### Metamora Horseless Carriage

A chance to showcase your vehicle and appointments. Open to two and four wheeled vehicles. Entries will be split into four categories: four-wheeled built before 1940, four-wheeled built after 1940; two-wheeled built before 1940 and two-wheeled built after 1940. Carriage need not be entered in other classes at the show.

### Division Champion and Reserve Champion Presentations

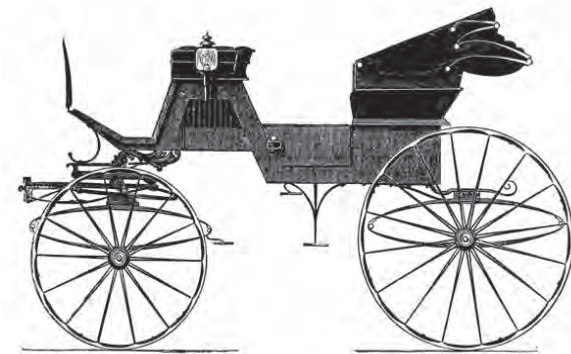
These awards are based on points earned in qualifying classes. Winners will be announced and prizes given in the main ring immediately following the last point class in each division. A tie in championship points may be broken at the Judge's discretion by best placing in the reinmanship class (or working class if reinmanship is no offered) or by a work-off. A tie for reserve may be decided by a coin flip if all parties agree.

### Grand Champion Invitational

The Champions from the Single Horse, Single Large Pony, Single Small Pony, Pair Horse and Pair Pony divisions will be invited to participate. They will be judged as in a working class. There is no entry fee.

### Concours D'Elegance

The Class is to be judged by overall impression throughout the Show. The winner will be the turnout, which, in the opinion of the Judges, presents the most elegant effect. This will include vehicle, harness, appointments, horse(s), driver, passengers, grooms, etc., but above all, general impression is most important. Period costumes are prohibited. The award will be presented in the Main Ring immediately following the winner's last class Sunday afternoon. All entries are automatically considered and there is no entry fee.

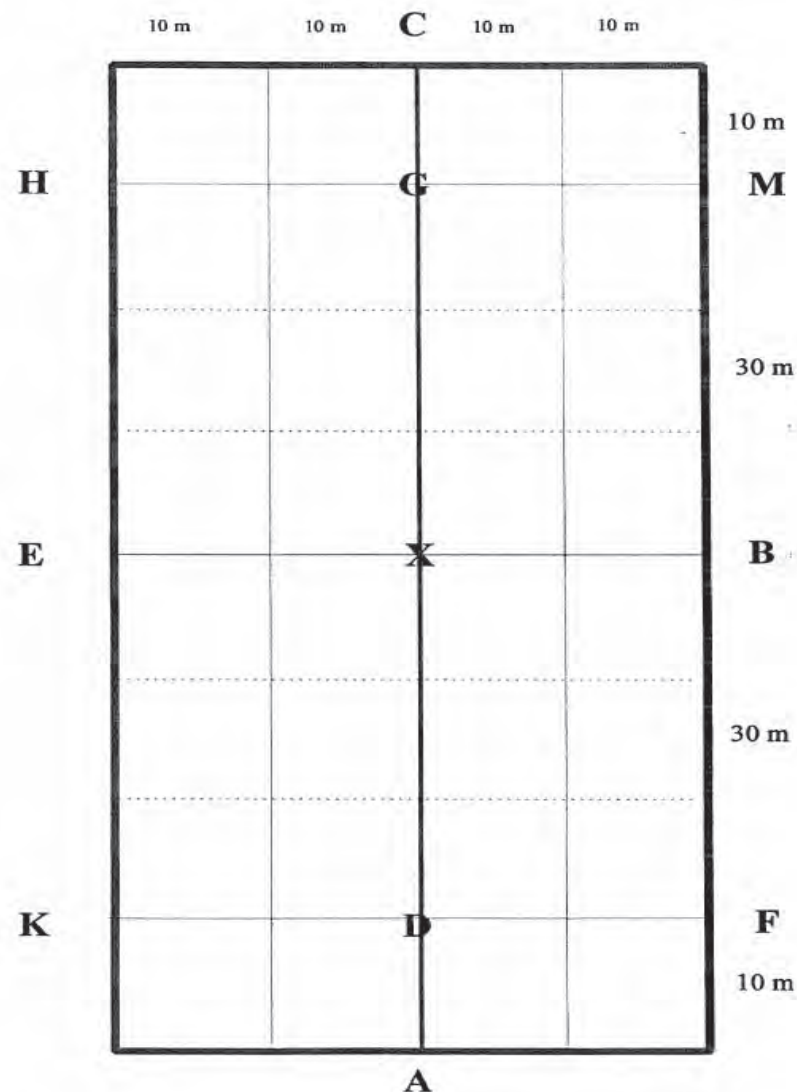
## Program for Friday

1. Friday's divisions are Single Horse, Single Large Pony, Single Small Pony and Pair Horse/Pony.
2. There is a drivers' meeting at 8:00am Friday.
3. Assigned times for dressage classes will be posted Thursday. Drivers should proceed to the timed competition class immediately following their first dressage class.
4. Vehicles must be available for wheel measurement no later than one hour before the entry's first dressage class.
5. There are 3 levels of dressage: Training #1, Preliminary #1 and Intermediate #4. A driver may enter two consecutive levels but only one placing (the best) will count toward the point total.
6. The Obstacle class will be a pleasure time competition class and will count toward the point total. It will be held outside the arena and therefore junior drivers under 11 are not permitted. The course may be driven only once.
7. The two placings have equal weight and the highest point total will determine the Challenge winner in each division. Dressage placing breaks ties. See section on Class and Division Awards for point detail.
8. Each entry consists of driver, horse, and vehicle; the entry must be the same for all of Friday's classes but can differ from what is driven on Saturday and Sunday. Marathon vehicles are permitted in any Friday class and drivers should dress on Friday as for dressage and cones in a CDE.
9. Drivers are encouraged to enter 3 classes but are not required to do so.
10. No classes on Friday count toward the Pleasure Division Championships.
11. Six ribbons for each class as well as the four division Combined Challenge awards will be presented at the Friday evening cookout.

### Obstacles - Time Competition Class Description

1. To be driven over a prescribed course of obstacles. The number of obstacles to be proportionate to the dimensions of the driving area. For this show not to exceed 20 obstacles.
2. The cone settings (plus wheel measurement) are: Single Horse, Single Large Pony and Single Small Pony 14 inches (35cm), and Pair Horse/Pony 16 inches (40cm).
3. After passing the starting line, the driver shall proceed through each obstacle in order to the designated finish line.
4. Course faults are assessed as penalty seconds, and are added to the driver's elapsed time. Placings are determined on a low total time basis. Ties for first will be decided by a drive-off.
